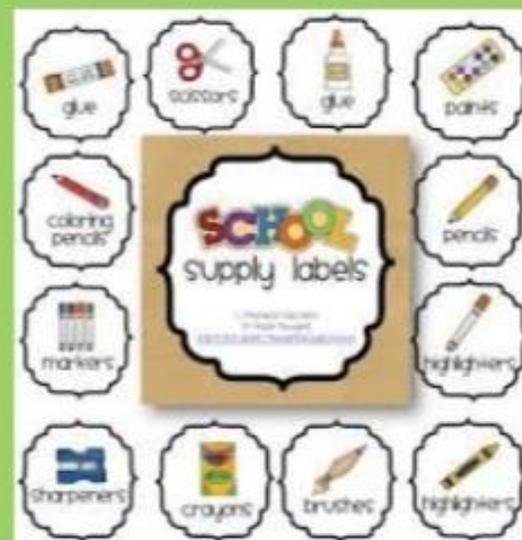
Support communication

Communication Supports

Understand how your child communicates

Provide tools to help child participate in class (e.g. AAC)

Dscba.org has a low-tech library with great communication tools!

Help your child's teacher understand best communication strategies and practices (e.g 10-second rule)

Time Management Supports



Visual Schedule



First/Then board



Visual timers - there's an app for that :)



Goal is to foster independence!



Positive Behavior Supports

Provide clear expectations

Proactive, positive praise and reinforcement (catch them on task)

Visual supports to help child plan next steps and take charge of actions

Opportunity to request breaks

Access to sensory supports, if needed

Remember...

This is new and everyone is struggling to make it work, including you, your child, and his/her education team

Choose your battles – offer choices flexible learning options when you can and limit screen time/class time if it is not benefitting your child

When in doubt, ask for help! Utilize your education team and other resources, like DSCBA and your local SELPA
